6 pm **21st Century Cuba.** Conversation with expert **Oniel Diaz** about economic reform and the

private sector in Cuba.

7:30 pm Welcome dinner at La Guarida paladar. Opened in 1996, it is one of the early private

eateries in Cuba's long state-controlled dining scene.

am **Conversation with urban planner Miguel Coyula**, Cuba's "Explainer in Chief." Urban planner and professor lays a foundation of knowledge for you with his account of the last 500 years of Cuba and Havana's evolution.

10:30 am **Behind-the-scenes walking tour of Old Havana.** Explore the historic center and learn about the history and architectural importance of Old Havana, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1982, as well as off-the-beaten path stops to learn more about living conditions and the local economy.

**Lunch at El Del Frente.** One of the coolest restaurants in town, it is located on a spacious rooftop terrace/bar surrounded by Old Havana's historic architecture.

charming ambience that matches the delicious home-cooked food.

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Nightlife Attend salsa lessons with a private instructor. Learn the moves of Cuba's most famous type of dance.

9 am **Visit to the new project of IT entrepreneur Giulio Ricci** and learn about the software solutions that are offered to domestic and international clientele.
